### **Garbage Collection Information**

Once again to inform you that any large items, tv's, mattresses, sofas, etc. will not be picked up until the designated date, the last Tuesday of each month. Please do not put these items out until the large garbage collection. May 29/18 is the next large pickup. June 26/18 is the next one.

We DO NOT pick up as per By-Law #2000-09, Garbage Collection & Waste Disposal in the Village of Belledune:

(Excerpt from By-law #2000-09)

1. b) "Waste" means discarded building materials such as lumber and construction materials used for erection, alteration, demolition or repair of buildings or structures, residue from trees such as roots, stumps, trunks and large branches exceeding 3 inches in diameter, fencing, swimming pools, automobiles, snowmobiles, motorcycles, or related parts, stones, rocks, sand, gravel, manure, the remains of carcasses of any dead animals, petroleum products, radioactive or any other hazardous wastes or any other discarded material other than garbage or special collection waste.

We pick up "Garbage" which means refuse and other discarded matter produced within a dwelling house on a regular basis. It shall mean leaves, grass cuttings, providing that they are in a proper container not to exceed 50 pounds per container. We pick up "Recycling" as per the Recycling sheet sent out with containers.

We pick up "Special Garbage Collection Waste" means wooden crates, furniture, large household appliances, bicycles, discarded metals or tools under 50 pounds, branches no larger than 3 inches (bundled and tied – not longer than 4 feet in length and no larger than 2 feet by 2 feet square and other household items not normally picked up according to the by-law on the regular weekly collection. **Steel** must be sorted from the rest of the debris.

# Intro-To Women's self defence

Dave Degrouchie "FREE SESSIONS"



A little background on me: studied martial arts/combat sports for over 3 decades. Taught classes on and off over that time, kind of "retired" from that now, due to not having the time, or resources, to keep a "school" running. Lots of expense, very little return. Back in 2000, I authored a women's self-defense certification program, which was picked up well in the martial arts community.

Nowadays, I consistently train, but am only interested in coming out of the woodwork once in a while, to offer something for free. Always been a huge advocate of self-protection.

Anyhow, a 3-week mini-program would cover the following:

Session 1:

- Introduction. Cover different types of violent encounters, what self-defence is, the law and self-defence.

Session 2:

- Cover mental and emotional self-defence during, and after an encounter.

### 3 vs 3

### Rules for Novice to Pee-Wee

**HAVE FUN!!** This tournament is strictly for **FUN** and its foundation is **respect & fair play**. Any player who does not comply with this simple code will be asked to leave.

1. The games will be 2 periods of 15 minutes straight time.
2. Games will be half ice.
3. Maximum of 3 AAA player or AA players including goalie.
4. Guaranteed 4 games: 2 points for a win, 1 point for a tie.
5. **Maximum of 7 goal differential for each game played.**
6. In case of a **tie in the standings**, the winner will be decided according to the next criteria in decreasing order:
  - The winner between the two teams
  - Tie-breaking formula (Goals For divided by Goal For + Goals Against)
  - Goals against
  - Goals For
7. In case of **tie in a playoff game**, the winner will be decided by:
  - 2 minutes 2 players vs 2 players sudden-death overtime
  - If the tie persists, then a "Shoot Out" will decide the outcome (All 6 players will shoot) (1 to 6) – If the tie persist, keeping the shooters in the same order (1 to 6) - teams will send their shooters 1 by 1 until a winner is declared. All teams must have the same amount of shots.
8. No checking is permitted
9. General NHL hockey rules for any infractions (hooking, slashing, tripping, etc.).
10. **A penalty will see the opposing team be rewarded a penalty shot.** *Any player can take the penalty shot.* The penalty shot will be taken during play (no stoppage of time). Penalized team must go to the side boards and other team must stay on the other side of center ice until the shooter has returned to tag up.
11. A 5 minutes penalty will be given for any unsportsmanlike play. The penalty will result in a penalty shot along with the penalize player in the penalty box for 5 minutes. The penalized team will not play shorthanded. The penalty time starts when the player enters the box. The player skates back to his bench without interfering into the play once the penalty is over.
12. **A player receiving 2 five minutes penalties (at any time during the tournament) will instantly be ejected from the tournament.**
13. **No slap shots.** Stick not above ankle high.
14. The official's call is final, and any questioning of the official's call may result in an automatic player ejection.

15. Any unnecessary rough play will not be tolerated, and the player will be ejected from the game with a possibility to be ejected from the tournament.
16. After a goal (referee whistles), the puck must go behind goal line and the opposing team must tag up at the **red line**.
17. After a goalie freezes the puck (referee whistles), the puck must go behind the goal line and the opposing team must tag up at the **blue line**.
18. If the puck goes outside of the playing area, the referee will give the puck to the offensive team behind the center red line or to the defensive team behind the goal line with the offensive team tagging back to the center red line.
19. Teams roster will consist of 3 skaters on ice, 3 on the bench, 1 goaltender
20. Players can't play for different teams.
21. There are absolutely no appeals. Decisions by the Discipline Committee are **final**.
22. ***The tournament committee will not be responsible for any injuries that may occur.***
23. **Only players playing the game and tournament personnel will be allowed around players' bench.**
