Garbage and Recycling Collection Notice

Please note a few items in regards to the Collection of Recycling and Garbage:

- We are asking people to put their recycling bins out when it is ¾ full, when people wait until its full or overflowing it causes issues with the truck lift. Thank you for helping us out.
- The bins (or garbage bags) must be put out by 8:00am

It is our sincere wish that this event will mark a new relationship between Belledune, Pabineau First Nations and Ugpi'Ganjig (Eel River Bar First Nations) – a relationship based on recognition, rights, respect, cooperation and partnership. It is vital that we work together to achieve reconciliation and build a stronger future together.

We are honoured to be able to host an exhibition from the **Legacy of Hope Foundation**. The Legacy of Hope Foundation was created in 2000. Its mission is to educate Canadians about Residential Schools and its lasting impact on generations of First Nations, Inuit and Métis.

EXHIBITION:

Peter Henderson Bryce: A Man of Conscience

As medical health officer for the Department of Indian Affairs, Bryce found that large numbers of First Nations children were dying each year due to conditions in Residential Schools and lack of tuberculosis treatment from 1904 to 1921. The Truth and Reconciliation Commission estimates that more than 6,000 children died in the schools from preventable disease, abuse, and neglect. There may be more but it would be impossible to try to estimate how many at this point.

"Whistleblowers" from all walks of life called on Canada to help the children. The Federal Government and many Canadians chose not to listen, or to do the bare minimum, with tragic results. Many would have been saved had the Government listened to Dr. Bryce or if the public had become significantly outraged and pressed the Government to change the system and to stop the abuses.
