



The Appeals Committee is a committee of council which has the authority to hear appeals on a Notice to Comply. A Notice to Comply is the official order provided by a by-law enforcement officer stating that a property is dangerous or unsightly, and specifies what must be done to remedy the issue. Examples of remedies include enforcing the clean up a property, or reparation or demolishing of a structure. When a property owner is presented with an order and decides to appeal, a hearing is held with the Appeals Committee to allow the parties to present the reason for the appeal. The Appeals Committee has the authority to confirm, amend, extend the timelines or rescind the Notice to Comply order. The decision of the Appeal Committee needs to be in writing with supporting documentation.

Qualified candidates should have some level of municipal zoning or planning background, or equivalent experience in a related field. The Appeals Committee should be comprised of three (3) committee members with one (1) substitute member in case of a conflict of interest. Candidates for the Appeal Committee are appointed by resolution of council. Training will be provided to appointed members as required.

Free Community Volunteer Income Tax Program

Drop Off – Pick Up Only at 2471 Main St., Belledune

The 2023 income tax submission deadline filing date is April 30, 2024.

We Will be providing drop-off services starting **March 18, 2024.**

In order to be eligible for the Community Volunteer Income Tax Program, individuals must have a modest income and a simple tax situation.

This may include:

- Adults 65 years and older
- Housing-insecure individuals
- Indigenous peoples
- Modest-income individuals
- Newcomers
- Persons with disabilities
- Students and youth

Modest Income

The following table provides a guideline to determine what is considered a modest income. In general, a modest income means the total family income is less than or equal to the amount shown in the chart below, based on the size of the family.

Family Size	Total Family Income
1 person	\$35,000
2 people	\$45,000
3 people	\$47,500
4 people	\$50,000
5 people	\$52,000
More than 5 people	\$52,500, plus \$2,500 for each additional person

Suggested income levels (family size includes an individual, or a couple, and their dependants)

Simple Tax Situation

In general, a tax situation is simple if an individual has no income or if their income comes from these sources:

- Employment
- Pension
- Benefits, such as the Canada Pension Plan, Old Age Security, disability insurance, employment insurance, and social assistance
- Registered Retirement Savings Plans (RRSPs)
- Scholarships, fellowships, bursaries or grants
- Interest (under \$1,000)

Volunteers are not expected to answer complex tax questions. If a taxpayer needs information that is beyond the volunteer's expertise, they should go to **Canada.ca/taxes** or call **1-800-959-8281.**

Drop Off – Pick Up Process

- 1. Call the Municipal Office, Monday to Friday between 9:00 am noon and 1:00 3:00 pm, at 506-522-3715 to schedule a time for drop off of your information and documents.
- 2. Fill in the forms attached to this flyer if necessary, make copies if there is more than one individual in your household that needs income tax filed.
- 3. Make sure to sign documents where indicated.
- 4. Review the document provided "Required Documents" to make sure you provide all the documents we will need to file your income tax correctly.
- 5. Put all forms and your information slips into an envelope and put your name on the envelope.
- 6. Bring the envelope to the Municipal Office located at 2471 Main St., Belledune and drop it off at reception.
- 7. Once your income tax is complete, we will call you and arrange for you to pick up your filed return. Please make sure you provide a telephone number to be contacted
