Contact Tracing & Isolation	If you tested positive using a rapid test or lab-based PCR test, you will need to inform your close contacts and your employer. All household contacts, must isolate for: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 5 days if they are fully vaccinated, and 10 days if not fully vaccinated Isolation period starts the day your household member tested positive All non-household close contacts, must: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Self monitor for symptoms for 10 days regardless of vaccination status If close contacts develop any symptoms, they should complete the online assessment form 	Same as Level 1	Same as Level 1

** A single-household bubble includes the people you live with. Where required, a single-household bubble can be extended to include: caregiver(s), a family member that needs support from someone within the household, one other person who needs support (ex: someone who lives alone, or another family member). A single-household bubble can extend care to children from another household bubble for the purposes of informal daycare/online education support. This must be the same household bubble for the duration of Level 3.
