As of November 01, 2024 the Village of Belledune's recycling program will be managed by Circular Materials, the administrator of the common collection system and a not-forprofit organization that is committed to building an efficient and effective recycling system in New Brunswick.

WHY IS THE PROGRAM CHANGING?

New Brunswick's recycling programs were operated by Regional Service Commissions, entities, and First Nations communities. Now, under the Designated Materials Regulation – Clean Environment Act, New Brunswick is transitioning to a new model where producers – the organizations that produce the packaging and paper products – will be responsible for operating and funding the program. Please note that this new recycling program is for residents only, businesses within the Village of Belledune will not be affected and will continue to have recycling services offered by the municipality.

CONTACT INFORMATION:

<u>Starting November 01, 2024</u> the Village of Belledune will no longer be overseeing the recycling program for residents. For any recycling collection inquiries <u>after November 01, 2024</u> please contact Fero.

WHAT CAN I RECYCLE?

Here is a quick summary of the most common materials you can recycle.

Paper and cardboard

Paper, carboard and boxboard materials like newspaper, juice cartons and cereal boxes.

Plastics

Plastic materials like bottles, laundry detergent and yogurt containers.

Metal

Steel and aluminum cans and lids for food and beverage products



RECYCLE MORE AT REDEMPTION CENTERS:

Glass, white polystyrene foam, beverage cardboard, and flexible plastics are now accepted at participating redemption centers. For a full list of participating redemption centers please the Circular Materials website:

BE RECYCLE READY:

- Place your recycling bag at the curb by 7 a. m. on your regular collection day.
- Flatten and break down cardboard boxes to save space on recycling.
- Large quantities of carboard (6 or more boxes) bundle & tie so they are no larger than 30" x 30" x 8" (76 cm x 76 cm x 20 cm).
- Glass packaging, flexible plastics, white foam polystyrene, and beverage cardboard are not accepted curbside. Please bring to a redemption center near you.
- Give containers a quick rinse and remove caps.
- Leave labels on containers.


